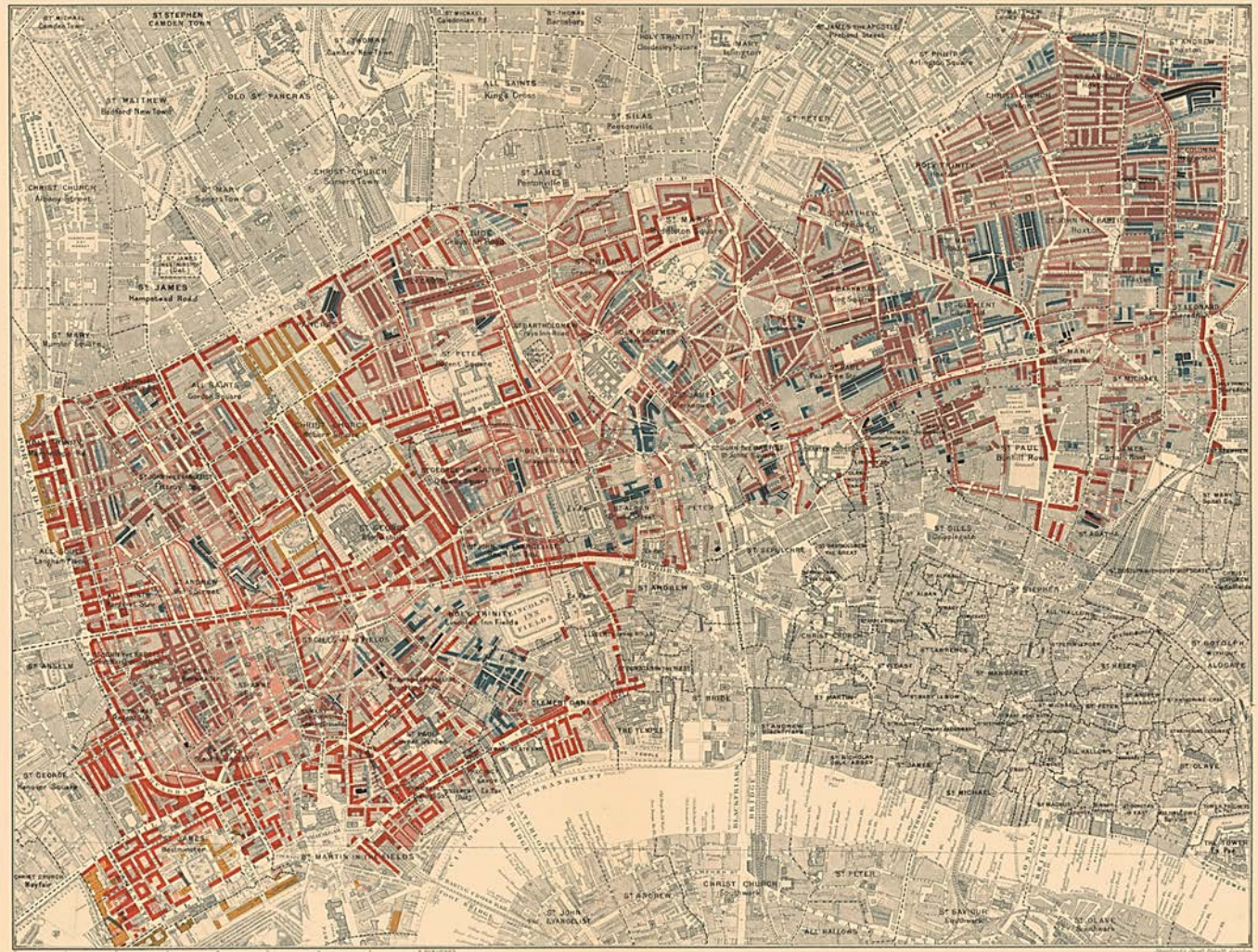


MAP DESCRIPTIVE OF LONDON POVERTY, 1898-9

THE STREETS ARE COLOURED ACCORDING TO THE GENERAL CONDITION OF THE INHABITANTS, AS UNDER—  
 ■ Lowest class. Vicious, semi-criminal. ■ Very poor, casual. Chronic want. ■ Poor. Live in 2 1/2, & work for a moderate family. ■ Mixed. Some comfortable, others poor. ■ Fairly comfortable. Good ordinary earnings. ■ Middle class. Well-to-do. ■ Upper-middle and Upper class. Wealthy.  
 A combination of colours—as dark blue and black, or pink and red—indicates that the street contains a fair proportion of each of the classes represented by the respective colours.
