**BIO:** Domenico Bertoloni Meli teaches in the Department of History and Philosophy of Science at Indiana University, Bloomington. He is the author of *EQUIVALENCE AND PRIORITY: LEIBNIZ VERSUS NEWTON* (Oxford, 1993, paperback 1997) and *THINKING WITH OBJECTS: THE TRANSFORMATION OF MECHANICS IN THE SEVENTEENTH CENTURY* (Hopkins, 2006). His new book, *MECHANISM, EXPERIMENT, DISEASE: MARCELLO MALPIGHI AND SEVENTEENTH-CENTURY ANATOMY* will be published by Hopkins in 2011. Domenico Bertoloni Meli has received several fellowships and awards, including a Membership at the Institute for Advanced Study at Princeton and a Guggenheim Fellowship. He is currently working on anatomy and physiology in the 17th century.
